12. Orriols park


The Orriols garden or Orriols municipal park covers an area of $43.977 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$. It was opened in September 2000, fulfilling a long-cherished wish of the local residents.

It is in the new area of Orriols, in the San Lorenzo neighbourhood, facing the Estadi Ciutat de València and has become the neighbourhood's green lung, leisure and recreation area.

This quadrangular public park has entrances through the four streets around it: Beata Genoveva Torres street, Arquitecto Tolsá street, San Vicente de Paul street and Santiago Rusiñol street.

It has a classic design. From the entrances you will reach the heart of the park in a straight line, where there is a rectangular pond with a circular pergola with 6 columns supporting a dome covered with blue trencadís.

It has a sports complex with a municipal swimming pool and facilities for swimming, tennis, paddle tennis and other sports.

Facing the sports area, there is a children's play area.
The garden has a large rose garden, a pond and fountains. Notable trees in the park include sycamore trees, London plane trees, white mulberry trees, cypresses, rosewoods, Japanese cherry trees and pines, among others.

It is the only park in the city of València, where we can still find the "parotet", a native species of dragonfly. In order to conserve this species, no insecticide is used and it is watched over and protected by the neighborhood association of the Orriols-Rascanya.

An extension is planned to incorporate urban vegetable gardens in the area.

## How to get there on foot?

Santiago Rusiñol street contains one of the entrances to Orriols Park, facing the Estadi Ciutat de València.

Located in a flat area, with dips in the pavements with tactile visual signage.

## Parking

Bicycle parking at the entrance to Arquitecto Tolsà street, No. 39.
Two reserved places in San Vicente Paul street $s / n$, beside the entrance to the Orriols Sports Complex. The places are $500 \times 200 \mathrm{~cm}$ and are located at the door of one of the entrances to the park.

Two reserved places in Santa Genoveva Torres street, No. 21, at the door of the Arena shopping centre. There is an accessible route, with homogeneous paving as far as the park and dips in the pavements.

The two places are more than $500 \times 350 \mathrm{~cm}$, in a battery, and have horizontal and vertical signage. The latter has reduced visibility due to the foliage of a tree near the sign.

There is a reserved place in Santa Genoveva Torres street, No. 30, with an accessible route to the park and with dips on the pavements. The place is more than $450 \times 350 \mathrm{~cm}$, with vertical and horizontal signage.

Reserved space in Duc de Mandas street, No. 23. With vertical and horizontal signage. More than 500 cm long and more than 200 cm wide.

Two reserved spaces in the place No. 81 Res Urb, in Arquitecto Tolsá Street $\mathrm{s} / \mathrm{n}$, next to the Salut Arquitecto Tolsà Health Centre. With vertical and horizontal signage. 600 cm long $\times 200 \mathrm{~cm}$ wide.

## Access

The park has four entrances on different streets:

- One access located on Santiago Rusiñol street, No. 15, facing the official store of the Estadi Ciutat de València.
- One access in Arquitecto Tolsà street No. 39.
- One access in Santa Genoveva Torres street, No. 26.
- One access located on San Vicente de Paul Street $s / n$ next to the Orriols Sports Complex.

All accesses are from the street; they have no slopes and they have a permanent opening gate with more than 500 cm of free passage width.

## Mobility indoors

The park has furniture to rest throughout its route and with gravel areas and cobbled areas.

There are small 2 cm kerbs separating the gravel area from the cobbled area.
It also has bio healthy equipment near the access to Arquitecto Tolsà street. The park has a children's play area near the Santiago Rusiñol access.

It also has garden areas with lawns.
The main route has cobbled paving with more than 200 cm of free passage width, with occasional narrowings of more than 100 cm due to the rest furniture.

It has a pergola in a pond in the middle of the park.
Access is via a walkway preceded by a ramp on either side of a staircase, with an average slope of $6.2 \%$; it is 500 cm long and has 112 cm of free passage width. No handrails.

There is no protective skirting board on one side.
There is a walkway with 188 cm of free passage width, with homogeneous, nonslip flooring.

There is a railing around the pergola with the pond at a height of 88 cm . There is an 11 cm high step to access the pergola's rest area.

The park has an area where the ground is all gravel.
To go to this area of the park, there is an isolated, single flight staircase with 3 steps with a 16 cm riser and a 37 cm tread. It has more than 300 cm of free passage width. No nozzle, no handrail.

Cleared by a $3.5 \%$ ramp with a medium incline, it is more than 500 cm long and has 300 cm of free passage width. No handrails.

## Dog socialisation área

The park has a dog socialisation area in Arquitecto Tolsà street, No. 36.
Access to the dog socialisation area, through a heavy gate with more than 200 cm of free passage width, and opening inwards.

The dog socialisation area has gravel ground.
There are unmarked kerbs on the route.
It has furniture for rest inside.

## Access

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- One access in Santa Genoveva Torres street, No. 26.
- One access located on San Vicente de Paul street s/n next to the Orriols Sports Complex.

All accesses are from the street and free of slopes, with doors that are permanently open.

## General mobility $\hat{\boldsymbol{\lambda}}$

There are unmarked trees and streetlights in the gravel pavement area that obstruct the path.

There are small 2 cm kerbs separating the gravel area from the cobbled area.
There is a pergola in the middle of the park.
It is accessed through a walkway preceded by a ramp on either side with a $6.2 \%$ average incline; it is 500 cm long and has 112 cm of free passage width. No handrails. Not protected on one side of the ramp.

Or via a staircase, a 3 step flight with a 37 cm tread, a 17 cm riser, with nosing, with no protection on either sides and with no handrails. It has more than 300 cm of free passage width.

## Mobility indoors $\star$

There is a walkway to access the pergola, free of slopes, dips or projecting obstacles.

11 cm step to access the rest area within the pergola. This area has 6 unmarked columns.

It is accessed via a walkway preceded by a ramp on either side with a $6.2 \%$ average incline; it is 500 cm long and has 112 wide free of passage. No handrails. Not protected on one side of the ramp.

It can also be accessed through a 3 step, single flight staircase with a 37 cm tread, a 17 cm riser, with nosing, with no protection on either side and no handrails. It has more than 300 cm of free passage width.

## Access

The access gates allow visual communication with the outside.

## General mobility

There are information panels showing information about services and itineraries.
